### Vocational School Building Project

Last quarter we reported our very exciting news that to save lives in a much more economical and efficient way (training them in an employable skill and seeing them truly free with counseling, discipleship and prayer) the best solution was to build our own vocational school with boarding exclusively for these Trokosi and orphans.

The initial drafts were done of each of the four buildings, BUT we have added one more building; a residence for the Director/Administrator of the school. (See full story on page 2.)

Despite our physical limitations due to the Covid restrictions with the borders still closed, our God is not under any limitation. so the building process has begun and work is ongoing daily.

## The Building Process Begins

#### The Land Cleared:

For several days two young men worked to cut and clear all the brush, grass and small saplings from our Duamenefa Foundation land to prepare it for the building process.



Pictured at the right are ten "trips" of sand which, with 100 bags of cement, and water, will make approximately 4,000 blocks; a great start. It takes sand, cement and water to make blocks, but at this point even the water must be brought in (seen yellow canisters at right.

The masons will mix the three with expertise knowing exactly what mix is the best and into metal forms they will shovel and pack the damp mixture one by one to form a block leaving in the hot sun to dry.







Foundations are dug by hand and the foundation is built with a different block made with sand, cement, water gravel to make it stronger. Usually a larger sized block mold is used as well. We have started making foundation blocks yet.

To give you some perspective, One trip of sand costs GhC160 or approximately \$30, one bag of cement is Gh43 or \$7.80 We need plenty more including the gravel for the foundation which will cost about Gh300 per trip or \$53.

As you can see, anyone can help in buying bags of cement or a trip of sand. What about YOU? It is about setting captives free!

#### **EXCITING NEWS! WE ARE EXPANDING OUR PROJECT!**


